### Quizzes/Tests/Final:

- Quizzes will be worth around 15 points and be given every week or so. Quizzes may be retaken for the full amount of credit possible within a three week limit.
- Tests will be worth around 50 points and be given every few weeks. Tests may be retaken for a maximum of 70%. Tests must be retaken within the 3 week limit.
- One final, comprehensive exam will be given at the end of each term. Every student will be required to take the final exam. The final will be worth 15% of the final, trimester grade.

### Assignments:

Assignments will consist of individual and group homework or class work. Work will generally be assigned every class period and will usually be due the following class meeting. Assignments will customarily be worth one to five. Longer assignments will be worth more. Late work will be graded for ½ credit. Students with unexcused absences will not be allowed to make up missed work. Assignments will be checked-in or handed in to the appropriate upper tray, on the table, at the side of the room. They will be returned, graded in the lower tray.

### Test/Quiz Make Ups:

Students will have one week from the day a test or quiz was given to make it up for full credit. During the second week, a maximum of 85% will be given, and during the third week, a maximum of 70% will be given. After three weeks, students will receive a 0% for the standard, and be signed up for math lab the following semester in place of an elective.
